Will Elon Musk be good for Twitter?





Billionaire Elon Musk is omnipresent in today's society.

An outspoken serial entrepreneur who has worn many hats, Musk is known to Canadians for furthering space exploration with SpaceX, pushing the electric vehicle sector with Tesla, being one of the founding forces behind PayPal, venturing into high speed travel with the Hyperloop, being Forbes Magazine's richest man alive, selling novelty flamethrowers, attempting to integrate the human brain with artificial intelligence using Neuralink, naming his son X AE A-XII and graduating from Queen's University.

In recent weeks, Musk has turned his attention to social media. Twitter recently accepted a bid by Musk for approximately US\$44 billion to take the company private under his ownership.


So we turned to Canadians to ask... Do you think this is a good thing or a bad thing for Twitter?

METHODOLOGY

From April 29 - May 3, 2022, Angus Reid fielded an online study among n=1,514 Canadian adults. The sample frame was balanced and weighted on age, gender, region and education according to the latest census data. For comparison purposes only, a probability sample of this size would yield a margin of error of +/- 2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

QUESTION 1.0

Do you think this is a good thing or a bad thing for Twitter?




No consensus, but Canadians are skeptical...

While there is no consensus on the issue, Canadians are more likely to think that Musk's ownership of Twitter will be a "bad thing" (39%) than a "good thing" (28%), with a third (34%) either expressing a neutral opinion about the deal or remaining unsure about its impact.

Women (43%) and university-educated Canadians (54%) are more likely to have a negative opinion of Musk's acquisition.

Not surprisingly, Canadians are more likely to think that Musk will be able to address tech issues with Twitter through things like:

Canadians believe Musk will foster an improvement in freedom of speech on the platform






Canadians believe Twitter will become worse at limiting the spread of disinformation under his leadership

How Will Musk Fare As Leader?

The statements above indicate that there is no strong consensus on how Elon Musk will perform as CEO, although few expect him to outright fail. However, Canadians seem to understand that Twitter moderation is an extremely difficult task: 43% agree that Musk may have overestimated himself within that arena, compared to only 30% who disagree.

If the past is any indication of Musk's future with Twitter then one thing is for certain – Musk will not be a boring leader.
