

In partnership with Woman Abuse Council of Toronto (WomanACT), the Angus Reid Group conducted an online study to understand the experiences Torontonians have with Toronto public transit and their overall feelings of safety.



April 25th – May 3rd, 2022



A representative sample of n=1550 **adults in Toronto.** The respondents are members of Angus Reid Forum.

For comparison purposes only, this sample plan would carry a margin of error of +/- **2.5 percentage** points, 19 times out of 20.

One-quarter of Torontonians say they do not feel safe taking public transit.

Women and people of colour are less likely to feel safe when using public transit.




Transit trips at night feel unsafe for half of riders.

Transit riders feel most unsafe when using the subway (when compared to the bus or trolley), and when travelling in the evening or nighttime.



Almost one-half of transit riders have experienced some form of harassment in the last year.

Women are far more likely than men to have experienced sexual harassment while riding public transit.





Women are far more likely to take measures for safety reasons.




